

## Livingstone College and Food Lion Feeds Partner to Unveil Campus Food Pantry

Among First CIAA Campuses to Open Pantry, Blue Bear Pantry Expected to Serve 225 Students Each Week

Livingstone College, in partnership with Food Lion Feeds, will open a food pantry today to address student hunger issues on campus. The pantry is located in Ballard Hall on the Livingstone College campus and will be open to students from 1 to 4 p.m. on Tuesdays and Fridays.

"We're excited to partner with Food Lion Feeds to offer an on-campus food pantry for our commuting students," said Livingstone College President Dr. Jimmy R. Jenkins, Sr. "The Blue Bear Pantry will assist our students by enabling them to have well-balanced diets that are consistent with maintaining proper nourishment, which is part of our Holistic College approach to learning."

Livingstone now becomes among 100 campuses nationwide that have food pantries to help eliminate hunger.

Food Lion Feeds donated more than 5,000 meals to stock the shelves at the pantry before opening its doors to students today and had local store associates help prepare the pantry for the grand opening. The pantry is expected to serve approximately 225 students each week.

"Food Lion is honored to partner with Livingstone College to open this pantry so that no student will ever have to choose between dinner and receiving an education," said Meg Ham, president of Food Lion. "Food Lion is committed to working with local partners to help end hunger in our communities, and recent data from Feeding America suggests that nearly ten percent of food bank clients are college students. The Livingstone pantry is among a dozen college pantries in North Carolina, according to publicly available data. In addition to Livingstone, Food Lion Feeds supports three other college campus pantries.
