



Food Lion Recalls Peaches from Select Stores

SALISBURY, N.C. – Food Lion is announcing that they are recalling bulk Yellow and White Peaches from some stores after being notified by its supplier that they could possibly be contaminated with Salmonella.

The items were sold in bulk in the produce section at select Food Lion locations. The affected products could have been purchased between June 1, 2020 - August 20, 2020.

The UPC for Yellow Peaches is #00000004038, and UPC for White Peaches is #00000004401.
